WS Building – Ground Floor

WS01	Mind mapping: a course in pictures (Mrs Watts) How to mind map and why it can be an effective revision tool. Simple instructions to get you started, and a variety of examples for inspiration. A general session useful for all subjects. This is a non-subject specific session focussing on suggestions for presenting your revision in a more brain friendly way than the traditional revision notes. Particularly good for visual learners.
WS02	Design and Technology Revision - Skills for Exam Revision (Mr Parker) Quick, effective revision tips for D&T!
WS03	Preparing a Revision Timetable (Ms Cook) How do you plan your revision effectively? This session will show you how to prepare a revision timetable to make sure your revision is regular and chunked into manageable amounts.
WS04	Preparing for the Maths Paper (Mr Daunt) The session will cover Maths GCSE exam question practice. There will be some GCSE questions to tackle and we will discuss the key features required to maximise success.
WS05	Looking after yourself during the exam period (Ms Hewitt) This session considers simple strategies to keep yourself healthy, maximise your potential and minimise exam stress.
